Aurora Hall of Fame

The Aurora High School **Athletic** Hall of Fame was established in 1982 by the Athletic Department. The **Distinguished Alumni** division was initiated in 2001 by the Aurora Alumni Association. In 2013, all areas of the Hall of Fame were put under the auspices of the Alumni Association which added a third area of recognition, **Honored Educator and Staff**. Under the Alumni Association format, all Hall of Fame candidates are now initially nominated by A.H.S. alumni and selected by a committee chaired by members of the Alumni Association Advisory Board. Future Hall of Fame inductees will be selected in all three divisions as determined by the number and qualifications of the nominated candidates.



Aurora High School Alumni Association

The Aurora Alumni Association was established in 1994 by A.H.S. alumni from the 1970s and '80s. During their first 13 years, the group developed a database of nearly 4,000 alumni, gave scholarships, sent out newsletters and started the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame program. After a five year period of inactivity from 2007 – 2012, the group reorganized under new leadership and established a Board of Directors that includes Aurora Alumni from every decade from the 1960s through today. The current revitalized group has established a website, increased their visibility, given scholarships and is proud to be annually inducting A.H.S. alumni in our Hall of Fame.

Jeff attended the Aurora Public Schools K – 12, graduating in 1966. He was a member of the much-heralded, undefeated Aurora Greenmen football teams of 1964 and 1965. In 1965, he caught critical touchdown passes in three separate games that greatly contributed to that year's undefeated PCL championship football team. Jeff lettered in Football all four years and was All-County Honorable Mention his senior year. An outstanding all-around athlete, Jeff earned 10 additional letters in three other sports including: four letters and two years' honorable mention in Basketball, three letters in Track including state qualifier on the mile relay team, three letters in Golf, where his team won the Cleveland District Golf Meet and were the first Aurora Golf team to qualify for State.

Jeff continued his athletic endeavors in college at Denison University where he was a walk-on, with no prior playing experience, on their nationally ranked Lacrosse team. Remarkably, he picked up the sport so fast that he lettered his sophomore, junior and senior years and served as the sole Team Captain his senior year. In his senior year, he also earned First Team All-Midwest and Honorable Mention All-American honors. In May 1969, Jeff and two teammates were featured in an article in *Sports Illustrated* regarding the emergence of Denison as a Midwest Lacrosse power. The article specifically addressed Jeff's athletic prowess and ability to learn the sport so quickly.

After graduation from Denison, he earned an MBA from the University of Denver and then served in the United States Air Force. Jeff has enjoyed a lengthy career in the institutional real estate investment business. Six years ago he formed his own company, where he specializes in arranging equity financing for institutional multi-family developments and acquisitions.

Jeff feels strongly that the Aurora Schools provided memorable teachers and coaches with tremendous community support for both academics and athletics. Lifelong friendships remain his most cherished memories.

Jeff and his wife, Ann, live in the San Francisco area. They have three grown children, one grandchild and a marriage of over 37 years loaded with blessings.

David Edmonds Class of 1975 Distinguished Alumni

David graduated from Aurora High School in 1975 where he played Basketball and Baseball. He graduated from Kent State University in 1980 where he was a member of the baseball team. After graduation, he began his career in the transportation business. In 1986, he joined Roadway Services, a transportation holding company from Akron, OH. He, along with several others, was responsible for the design and development of RPS, the fastest growing business ever known for its first five years in business. In 1998, he and his partners sold RPS to FedEx of Memphis, Tennessee. In 1999, the FedEx board elected him to the position of Senior Vice-President, Worldwide Services. In that capacity, he has traveled to over 200 countries managing various aspects of the corporation.

David serves on several Boards of Directors, including the Memphis Music Foundation, Ballet Memphis, the Nashville Symphony Orchestra and the Kent State Athletics Foundation.

In October 2014, the Kent State University Athletics Foundation dedicated a newly constructed building for Men's and Women's athletics. David was the lead donor and subsequently named the building in honor of his mother and father.

David's reflections of his time in the Aurora Schools are many. He genuinely appreciated the great counsel, guidance and learning opportunities from his teachers, coaches and administrators. David recalls that he really enjoyed playing Basketball and Baseball for Aurora, the many athletic events and the competitive spirit and school camaraderie before and after each game.

Having made many lifelong friends, he believes the social and academic setting at A.H.S. provided a launchpad for his future years, both professionally and personally.

Recalling his time at A H.S. David states "It was just too cool!"



Donna French Honored Educator/Staff Member Aurora City Schools Librarian

from 1968 - 1998

Donna Jane (Unger) French was born in November 1931 in Youngstown, Ohio. She grew up in Poland, Ohio where she graduated from high school in 1949. Donna attended Hiram College before entering nurse's training at Trumbull Memorial Hospital. She married Park French in September of 1952. In 1959, with four small children (and a 5th about to arrive) the family moved to Aurora and the town became their permanent home. A sixth child was born in 1961, and a seventh five years later.

In the early 1960s, despite the many demands of raising a large family, Donna devoted her energies to the task of creating libraries in Aurora's two elementary schools. The 1964-65 Elementary School yearbook was dedicated to "Mrs. Park French for her volunteer efforts this year to organize and operate the first elementary school libraries in Aurora." Donna continued to develop and run the libraries nearly full-time as a volunteer until the school district was able to hire her in 1968. Throughout her career, these welcoming libraries reflected her energetic commitment to the enrichment of *all* children through the limitless world found in books.

Hundreds of Aurora students remember Donna as a colorful, witty, engaging librarian who donned endless costumes for the seasons and various holidays. Her remarkable room decorations, special effects and treats created a fun, welcoming atmosphere that made her libraries a focal point for the students and the school. She retired from Aurora Schools 1998 after more than three decades of encouraging kids to imagine broadly, think creatively and pursue their dreams relentlessly.

Sadly, Donna died in 2013, two years after the death of her husband Park. However, all seven of their children: Linda Griffin, Jill French, Suzanne Spilsbury, Becky French Kalydosos, Annie French, Jodie French-Burr and Douglas, from five states, are with us today to honor their mother and her legacy in the Aurora Schools.



Shirley Duval Honored Educator/Staff Member

Aurora Schools Kindergarten Teacher from 1966 - 1996

Shirley Duval was born in Detroit, Michigan and moved to the suburb of Grosse Pointe at eight years old. She lived in Grosse Pointe in the winter and spent summers with her grandparents in Algonac on the St. Clair River. Her father was a surgeon and her mother was a housewife. She had one sister, as well as two orphaned cousins who lived with them. Shirley graduated from Grosse Pointe High School in 1942. She graduated from the University of Michigan in 1946 with a degree in Geography, majoring in Cartography.

The Duvals moved to Aurora in 1954 where a neighbor, Sally Cook, was an Aurora kindergarten teacher. When Sally Cook's health forced her retirement in the middle of the 1966-67 school year, Aurora quickly needed to find a kindergarten teacher. At the urging of friends and neighbors, Shirley applied and was hired despite the fact that she did not have an education degree. She started her education courses that fall and spent twelve years earning a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree in Education from Kent State.

Shirley's first twelve years of teaching kindergarten in Aurora were in the basement of the Catholic Church. Eventually the kindergarten classes were moved to Craddock, and then Miller school. In 1996, Shirley retired after thirty years of teaching in Aurora.

Shirley married her husband of 62 years, Len, upon graduation from the University of Michigan. They have four children: a daughter, Colleen, now in Clermont, Florida, and sons Lenny, in Ravenna, Ray, in Solon, and Patrick, in Denver, Colorado. They have four granddaughters, three grandsons, one great-granddaughter and four great-grandsons.

Shirley reflects that there was nothing better than when she could see the sparkle in a child's eyes when they realized they had accomplished something - from being able to read, know all the letters and their sounds, or counting to 100. Her goal was "to help children like school because they had a long way to go."
